Project History:

The Kenya project at SSHL started in 2005 as a solution to the IB-students need for a CAS project and the struggle in Wagwe, the Kenyan home village of SSHL employees Alice Odhiambo and Hulda Palm.

There are many orphan children in the area and the need for education is endless.

The scholarship program

We started to help 2 girls with secondary education and as the project proceeded, after 2 years we had 8 students in the program.

In 2010 we formed the vision of building a nursery school and in 2011 we purchased a piece of land and started the fundraising to build the school.

In november 2012 we started the first building, and in january 2014 we opened our school, the Mama Norah Education Centre.

Meanwhile our scholarship students have all graduated and are now working and self supported.

The Mama Norah Education Centre

Our aim and vision is to build a complete primary school, that started with the mixed nursery/primary one class in 2014, which is to be complete with all 10 classes by 2020. We are also planning to have education in tailoring, carpentry and household agriculture/farming.
